# GENERAL RULES

## PLEASE TAKE THE TIME TO READ THE RULES FOR THE SHOW

1. For RoR registered horses only, holding current Competition Membership and for riders/handlers aged 15 years or over at 1st January 2024
2. Registration link: <https://www.ror.org.uk/registration>
3. The Rules of RoR will be in force at this event: <https://www.ror.org.uk/rules>
4. Anyone mounted on a horse at any time, must wear a current standard safety hat with the chin strap fastened correctly
5. All ridden horses, dressage, showing and jumping, must be aged 4 years or over.
6. In the interest of horse welfare, RoR has implemented new conditions for anyone entering a horse at this event.
  - a) If, in the opinion of the Organiser and/or RoR, any horse's welfare is believed to be compromised, the immediate removal of that horse from any arena will be requested
  - b) RoR discourages the showing of over fat horses in ALL show classes and judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.
  - c) RoR reserves the right to disqualify competitors at RoR events if in the opinion of the officials there is a mismatch between the weight and size of the rider and the horse. The official's decision is final.
  - d) Policy Statement: There is widespread concern that the welfare of certain horses is being compromised by overweight riders. There are many other factors involved, including the skill and fitness of the rider; the weight, size and fitness of the horse; the nature of the exercise and the suitability of the tack. As a general guide the weight of the rider and saddle should not exceed 17% of the horse's optimum weight consistent with a body condition score of 3/5. In practical terms this means that a 500kg thoroughbred can carry up to 13 1/2 stone. An overweight horse with a body condition of 4/5 (fat) or 5/5 (obese) is already carrying significant burden and the weight of the rider must be reduced accordingly.
  - e) If, in the opinion of the Judge/Judges, in any class, a horse is unsound, the horse must be withdrawn from the show by the Participant and/or Owner and leave the ring. A Judge may also ask a Participant and/or Owner to remove his horse from the ring, if in his/her opinion the horse or the Participant or Owner, is ill-mannered. If in the opinion of the Judge the behaviour of a horse is deemed unacceptable, it will be reported to RoR and will be reassessed at its next show by a person appointed by RoR.
7. There will be routine sampling taking place at this event under FEI ruling. For more details about banned substances: <https://inside.fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules>
8. The organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards
9. OBJECTIONS must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £100. The deposit will be returned upon successful acceptance and approval of such objection. Any objections must be lodged with the RoR MD by the end of the event on Sunday 25th August 2024 by emailing [info@ror.org.uk](mailto:info@ror.org.uk)
10. In the event of any class being over/under subscribed, we reserve the right to cancel any open class of our choice and a full refund of entries will be given.
11. It is the competitor's responsibility to check each individual class criteria for eligibility.
12. In the event of the dressage classes being oversubscribed, a waiting list will operate
13. The Organiser reserves the right to change the Ring allocation if entries/weather conditions warrant.
14. It is the competitors responsibility to enter the classes that they are qualified and eligible for and to read the schedule. Entries will be forfeited if entrants are not eligible.
15. All entrants must also adhere to Aintree International Equestrian Centre's terms and conditions which can be viewed on <https://aintreeequestriancentre.co.uk>
16. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers, RoR or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers, RoR nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury, illness to horses, owners, riders, grooms, spectators, dogs, exhibitors, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever. The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.

# VACCINATIONS

## IMPORTANT NOTES RE PASSPORTS, VACCINATIONS & EQUINE INFLUENZA (EI)

### Vaccination policy for the stables

As per Aintree Equestrian Centre terms and conditions for this event, all horses STABLING at Aintree EC must have had a booster vaccination against Equine Influenza in the **PRECEDING 6 MONTHS**, and be **6 days clear of having had any vaccination**. The last vaccination must have been between the **23rd February 2024 and the 16th August 2024**. **ALL PASSPORTS WILL BE CHECKED ON ARRIVAL**. Horses will not be permitted to stables at Aintree if they do not have the correct vaccinations.

### Vaccination Policy if competing but not stabling

All horses ATTENDING BUT NOT STABLING at Aintree EC must have had a booster vaccination against Equine Influenza in the **PRECEDING 12 MONTHS**, and be 6 days clear of having had any vaccination. **PLEASE HAVE YOUR PASSPORT AVAILABLE FOR CHECKING**.

1. Every horse attending this event (including travelling equine companions) must be accompanied by their own current and undeniably valid passport with up to date records of vaccinations for Equine Influenza, completed, signed and stamped on each line by a Veterinary Surgeon, who is not the owner of the horse.
2. Horses stabling on site - passports must be presented to the Stable Yard Manager for inspection before horses are unloaded
3. Horses not stabling on site – passports must be presented at the Show Office before being unloaded.
4. NO VALID PASSPORT – NO ACCESS AT ALL
5. Horses may be scanned for microchip identification.
6. Owners, grooms, riders and all personnel to heed any bio-security rules and recommendations in place and must take all reasonable precaution to avoid unnecessary cross-contamination.

2. Correct competition dress should be worn during any prize giving

3. All showjumping classes will be judged under BS Club Membership rules and will be single phase.

The exception to these rules, is that, as per RoR rules for competitions, all riders must be aged 15 yrs or over at 1st January of current year

4. For 2024, the inaugural year for the Showjumping Championship, any member with a competition membership may enter any level. A maximum two consecutive levels per combination (ie the rider can do more on different horses)

5. All classes will be run single phase

6. If you wish to record your results then a minimum of BS Club Membership is required

7. Special rosettes to 10th and Finalist rosette to each competitor

8. Winner's rug to the Champions

9. There will be a mounted presentation for the top six in each Championship class

1. For all RoR Competition Registered horses and combinations (horse/rider) who have qualified via the RoR Arena Eventing Leagues 2023 - 2024
2. Special rosettes to 10th and Finalist rosette to each competitor.
3. Winner's rug to Champion
4. There will be a mounted presentation for the top ten in this class
5. A two-phase competition. Competitors to jump a course of show jumps immediately followed by a course of cross-country/working hunter fences.
6. Optimum time will be published in advance and will be based on speed per minute as agreed with Course Designer.
7. Drawn orders will be issued in advance of the day.
8. Eventing/XC kit to be worn.
9. Back protectors are compulsory
10. No stop watches allowed.
11. The Judges' decision is FINAL.
12. The winner will be the competitor with the lowest number of penalties.
13. The whole round will be timed. In the event of a tie, the winner will be the one closest to, but under the OPT time with a clear round.
14. There will be no more than 20 jumping efforts

# DRESSAGE RULES

1. All Dressage classes will be judged under British Dressage rules.
2. Whips and Callers are NOT allowed in the Championship classes
3. Provisional times will be released on the 16th August.  
Confirmed times will be released the evening before the day of the class to allow for withdrawals  
It is the competitors responsibility to check timings
4. Two Bridle Numbers must be worn during working in and whilst competing and must be clearly visible
5. No draw reins or martingales allowed.
6. Breast plates are allowed. Intro, Prelim and Novice classes – snaffle bridles only.
7. Competitors may enter Championship classes at two consecutive levels only, so long as they are qualified.
8. Freestyle to Music: general rules applicable to these classes – please see BD Members Handbook
9. REMINDER to everyone taking part in dressage and FSM classes – the trimming of whiskers and horses' ears is banned. Please see Welfare Section of the BD Members Handbook. This is available online via the British Dressage website.
10. There is a restriction to the number of dressage classes that any horse may be entered in, on a single day.  
Horses competing at Novice level or below: 4 classes including warm-up tests, Elementary & Medium 3 classes including warm-up tests, Advanced Medium and above – 2 classes including warm-up
11. Official BD Stewards will be appointed and tack inspections will take place
12. Please see BD Members Handbook for rules re tack and competition wear
13. Entries maybe restricted in any class including Championships. In the event of a class being oversubscribed then a wait list will operate and members will be notified of spaces as they come available.
14. Dispensation certificates are to be presented to the secretary before the start of the class.
15. Competitors must attend prize givings, or ensure that they are represented, when requested by the Organiser.
16. Failure to attend (unless agreed with the Organiser) may result in forfeit of prize money, rosettes or other awards.
17. Prize givings will be mounted unless otherwise stated and correct competition dress should be worn.
18. All tests will be BD tests in use prior to July 2024.
19. There will be one guaranteed arena walk at the start of each dressage day in the indoor arena (early morning). Any further arena walks maybe added if timing allows, but not guaranteed.

## RoR Elite Performance Award for DRESSAGE 2024

### CLASS 38 - A freestyle test

at Advanced Medium level or above, PYO. The top six overall from classes 34 & 35. The winner will receive an award of £500 to be presented at the RoR Awards Evening (date tbc).

**Eligibility** - For all RoR competition registered horses. Riders must be 15yrs and over on 1 January of current year. The Elite Performance Award for Dressage – for qualified combinations only.

**Qualification criteria** - Qualification is via the RoR Dressage Horse Special at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree (20-25 August 2024) – two sections:

1. Restricted: for GB raced horses only who have not previously won the Special, and
2. Open: for all RoR competition registered horses including former winners of the Special and of the RoR Elite Performance Award for Dressage.

In order to qualify for the RoR Dressage Horse Special, members must submit two scores of 60% minimum gained at advanced medium level or above. Scores must be from standard BD tests and maybe affiliated or unaffiliated.

**Useful information** - Both sections to be judged: PYO advanced medium or above, highest score wins. Information on prizes to follow. The Championship final will be judged as a freestyle test at advanced medium level or above, highest score wins regardless of test. The class is for qualified horse/rider combinations only. No substitutions allowed.

PHASE 1 Jumping to be judged: 8 rustic & coloured jumps, 65cm to 75cm with a maximum spread of 70cm. The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round: 10 points to be deducted for a knock down. 15 points to be deducted for a refusal. 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall

PHASE 2 Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class) Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on a long rein.

### **CLASS 49 - Tattersalls RoR Former Racehorse Challenge 2025 Qualifier**

For GB raced/trained horses only. Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. The first 3 qualify for the final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree in 2025.

All entries must be registered with RoR and have raced in GB. Horses will NOT be ridden by the judge.

Horses may be stripped for conformation assessment at the discretion of the Judge.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The class to be judged 50% - jumping, 20% - Style while jumping and performance and 30% marks awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1 Jumping to be judged: 8 rustic & coloured jumps, 70cm to 80cm with a maximum spread of 75cm. The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round: 10 points to be deducted for a knock down. 15 points to be deducted for a refusal. 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall

PHASE 2 Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class) Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of 30 for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained. Points to be deducted at end of jumping round.

Fences at the Series Final can be up to 105cm.

Series Rosettes 1st – 4th

Veteran prize (15+) voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final 2025.

# SHOWING RULES

1. For the full RoR Showing Rules please see: <https://www.ror.org.uk/rules>
2. All horses competing must be registered RoR with a competition registration
3. All horses competing in ridden / challenge classes must be mares or gelding's 4yrs old or over and of any height
4. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited
5. If entry numbers warrant, the classes may be split
6. All classes will be directed by a Steward – competitors must follow the Stewards' instructions at all times
7. **Amateur definition:** An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/ has not during the current or previous season: Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses (for the show ring) in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or resided in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard (in the current season or previous season). Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not have received any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a show in the current or previous season. Horses must not have been ridden at a show by a rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season. Any breaches of this ruling may result in disqualification from future classes

## In-Hand Classes

1. In-Hand showing is open to mares, fillies and geldings aged 3-years-old or over
2. Horses do not need to be shod
3. Horses can be shown in a bitless or In-Hand Bridle
4. Racing injuries and blemishes are ignored in all In-Hand classes
5. A current standard safety hat/ kite marked hard hat with the chinstrap fastened must be worn at all times by any handler

## Ridden Classes

1. Ridden showing is open to Mares and Geldings, 4-years-old and over
2. Horses in ridden classes must be shod all round
3. All classes to be judged in the standard showing format unless otherwise stated
4. Competitors, may be asked to come out in pairs for their individual shows
5. The Judge will not ride, unless stated in the conditions of the class in the schedule
6. Horses being stripped for confirmation will be noted in the conditions for each class in the schedule
7. Horses will be stripped for conformation in Series qualifiers and finals
8. Whether racing injuries and blemishes are ignored or not in Ridden classes will be noted in schedule class information
9. Horses should be ridden in a Snaffle, Pelham or simple Double Bridle with a plain Cavesson noseband (any variations to this may be penalised by the judge)
10. All grooms entering a ring or warm up area must wear a current standard safety hat with the chin strap fastened at all times
11. Any exhibit in any class will not be penalised for being shown untrimmed, regarding whiskers around the muzzle and/ or the inner ears

## Evening Performance / Championships / Supreme

1. Evening Performance attire: Gentlemen wear Black (or Scarlet coat if eligible). Plain breeches may be worn and plain black or top boots. Hunting shirt and stock. Ladies wear black or blue coat, plain breeches and black boots. Hunting shirt and stock
2. Special exceptions for Evening Performance hat waiver form must be signed if you are not wearing a standard hard hat with chin strap. Hat waiver form available from the RoR show secretary point
3. In the The Tattersalls RoR Ridden Showing Series Supreme Championship horses will enter the ring in single file and be asked to line up. All exhibits will give a short individual show before result and presentation
4. If any Champions / Winners from the eligible Tattersalls series are unable to come forward for The Tattersalls RoR Ridden Showing Series Supreme Championship OR have already qualified for this through taking an alternative place in another series final, then the Reserve Champion / Second may be invited to take part. This will be at the discretion of the show
5. Any prize winner which fails to present for a championship without prior agreement from the show organisers, will result in the forfeit of prize money or other awards
