LIHS/BSPS CLASSES

MEMBERSHIP

Open to members and non-members for the qualifying classes but will need to join within seven days of qualifying to enter the Final or the qualification will pass down the line.

The winning pony in each class will qualify, qualification will go no lower than 3rd place. Horses/ponies do not need to have a JMB height certificate to compete in these classes.

The BSPS can request any animal to be measured at their discretion.

Ponies can be shown in any suitable bridles except Bitless bridles and running gags which are not permitted in any classes.

In the Coloured Classes the pony must be registered with either the British Skewbald and Piebald Association or Coloured Horse and Pony Society.

Riders and Owners must join the BSPS within seven days of qualifying to compete in the Final.

SHOW AND JUDGING RULES

All BSPS Classes will be judged under the BSPS Rules and the classification for the class. The BSPS Rulebook can be downloaded from the website www.bsps.com Judges may only judge one qualifying round in each class.

Any BSPS Judge can judge the Performance Classes, the BSPS Heritage Lead Rein Sports Pony and BSPS Heritage First Ridden Working Sports Pony Class, but must be on the WHP Panel to judge the Cradle and Nursery Stakes. Judges must take account of the suitability of the bridle for the type of pony when judging the class. Judges will be asked to provide a profile of their experience and equestrian history for use by the commentator. Judges may be expected to comment on their placings and result with the Commentator.

At County Shows this is to inform the competitor and the audience and enhance education for showing and the classes being judged.

The Cradle and Nursery Stakes height of fences will be Open Height in the BSPS Rule Book. All classes will be marked, in the event of a tie the performance marks take precedence.

RULES FOR COMPETITORS

In all Pony and Coloured Performance Classes competitors may use any suitable bridles including Micklem bridles, flash or grackle nosebands and a correctly fitted running martingale. Coloured or plain browbands can be used depending on the type of pony/horse being shown. In the Performance Pony Classes and the non-Native Coloured Horse or Pony Class animals must be plaited. In the Coloured Native/Cob/Traditional Class animals will be shown unplaited or hogged.

Mountain and Moorland Ponies will not be penalised in the Performance Classes for having non pulled tails and feathers but must be plaited. Judges should ask the age of the animal and what class the rider competes their horse or pony in e.g WHP, Pony Club, Sports Pony/Eventing, Dressage or Showing etc.

Judges will penalise riders who miss out a movement in the Performance Classes e.g not cantering a circle by 10 points per movement. The rest of the display will be marked based on the qualify and correctness of performance for the type of animal being judged based on rewarding a strong performance, penalising mistakes, not cantering on a straight line, heavily penalising bad manners and vice e.g bucking, rearing, napping etc

In the Mark section for Presentation, suitability and condition judges will consider the overall turnout. Marks will be deducted if the rider is unsuitably mounted. Presentation must consider and reward horses and ponies that are "fit not fat" and "fit for purpose" for their type, e.g an event/sports pony may carry less overall condition than a Show Hunter Pony.

In the Mark Section for Type and freedom of action judges will be awarding ponies that are the right type for the classification it is being shown in e.g WHP/Sports/Event/Hunter Type. Show Pony and in the Coloured classes traditional versus Cob or Native type. The movement of the pony must correspond to its type and way of going must be in accordance with the class it would mainly compete in.

No competitor will be allowed to compete the same horse/pony in the International Arena and the New Horizon Plastics Arena on the same day. If an entry is submitted via the relevant Showing Society for an International Arena class, the entry in the London Showing Series class will automatically be withdrawn and refunded.

DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT THE LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW (LIHS) – Classes 11 & 12 qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show (December 2025), highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify. A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a "wild card" will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

Rising Stars Amateur Rules For 2025 - Open to members and pre-registered non-members, 15 years & over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules. Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2025 are separate from BSHA Amateur rules. Please see the separate Rising Star Rulebook in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website (https://britishshowhorse.org/bsha-rising-stars-series/). If you are in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly to have your status confirmed.

QUALIFIERS - Those who qualify will be notified by email of their qualification. Those who qualify who hold pre-registration only for the series, must complete full LIHS registration for Rider/Owner/Horse within 14 days of date of issue of notification email, in order to confirm qualification. The cost of pre-registration is removed from the overall cost of the full LIHS registration. The BSHA will offer training clinics nearer the event to prepare all

Class 11 LIHS/BSHA RISING STAR Working Show Horse Qualifier - Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding 4 years old and over exceeding 148cms (14.2hds). Any horse which is a Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over. A Rider may ride up to 2 horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed (2025). The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. Height of fences – minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9", maximum spread 2'9". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course Builder/BSHA Representative.

Class 12 LIHS/BSHA RISING STAR of Working Hunter Type Qualifier- Open ONLY to Hunters, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cms (14.2hds). Any horse which is registered/previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over. A Rider may ride up to 2 horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed (2025). The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. Height of fences – minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course Builder/BSHA Representative.

Class 13 BSHA SEIB OPEN WORKING SHOW HORSE QUALIFYING CLASS

This class is a qualifier for the SEIB Open Working Show Horse Championship at the BSHA National Championships Show in September.

The two highest placed unqualified in the top five will qualify

Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms and registered with The British Show Horse or with a BSHA Day Ticket. This class is NOT open to Hunters, ie those horses registered and competing as a hunter or working hunter with BSHA, Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain or The Showing Register for the current season.

Any Horse which is a Grade B Showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above, as at the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible to compete in any Working Show Horse class.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase but must then select one Horse to take through to the Ride and Conformation phases (if required). No change of Rider is allowed.

Height of Fences

Open: 2'9 maximum 3'0, maximum spread 3'0.

In the event of a tie in marks, the Conformation mark will take precedence, followed by the Ride mark, followed by the Style mark.



Class 14 NOVICE WORKING STYLE & PERFORMANCE

(Open to Members & Non-Members) Mare or gelding, four years old and over exceeding 148cms. Each combination must jump a course at 70cm (2'3") and a set show to be marked on performance of movements made (set show requirements – Not to exceed 2.5 minutes. Walk trot and canter on both reins. Show a halt in the middle of the show for 4 secs before proceeding. Show a canter change across the diagonal through trot 5 strides. Include lengthened strides in canter).

* Exhibits will not be ridden by the Judge.

Class 15 OPEN WORKING STYLE & PERFORMANCE

(Open to Members & Non-Members) Mare or gelding, four years old and over exceeding 148cms. Each combination must jump a course at 90cm (3'0") and a set show to be marked on performance of movements made (set show requirements – Not to exceed 2.5 minutes. Walk trot and canter on both reins. Show a halt in the middle of the show for 4 secs before proceeding. Show a canter change across the diagonal through trot 5 strides. Include lengthened strides in canter).

* Exhibits will not be ridden by the Judge.



Day membership must be purchased from VHS head office at least 2 weeks in advance of the show, at a cost of £25.00. Payment by telephone and a credit or debit card is required. A day membership show card and age badge will be provided. Owners who are not compeng are not required to be a member.

All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Members and Day Members must carry their current VHS membership cards in the ring and produce these on request – no exceptions will be made. No card, no entry or qualification

VHS Supreme Final qualification. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd in each class will qualify directly for the corresponding class at the VHS Supreme Final, to be held at the National Veteran Championships, 29th–31st August 2025. For classes with fewer than 5 entries forward, Supreme Final qualifications will be awarded at the judge's discretion and are not guaranteed.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 3rd -4th in each class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. VHS M&M Supreme Final qualification. This is only given at the judge's discretion and will be to the highest placed M&M in each class to qualify for the VHS M&M Supreme Final at the National Veteran Championships. Show Card/Day Membership to be signed. Only open to registered M&M breeds.

Members and Day Members will have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Day members must become full VHS members within 21 days and exchange their day showing card for a full showing card in order to validate their qualification for the Supreme or Regional Final qualification. Regional Finals are open to members only.

If the competitor has already qualified or does not wish to attend, they must refuse the qualification and pass it down the line on the day. Day members must become full VHS members in order to enter the Supreme Final.

For classes with fewer than 5 entries forward, Supreme Final qualifications will be awarded at the judge's discretion and are not guaranteed. Once you have a Supreme Qualification you must enter the Supreme Final within 21 days of gaining the qualification – no late entries accepted. All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, 29th–31st August 2025. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule. Entries on–line via the VHS website.

Class 29 PRE-VETERAN IN-HAND. 15-19 years. Open to horse and ponies of any breed and height. Highest placed M&M to qualify for the corresponding Supreme Final - on judge's discretion.

Class 30 DIAMOND VETERAN RIDDEN. 25 years and over. Open to horse and ponies of any breed and height. Highest placed M&M to qualify for the corresponding Supreme Final - on judge's discretion.

Class 31 VETERAN RIDDEN. 20-24 years. Open to horse and ponies of any breed and height. Highest placed M&M to qualify for the corresponding Supreme Final - on judge's discretion.

Class 32 PRE-VETERAN RIDDEN. 15-19 years. Open to horse and ponies of any breed and height. Highest placed M&M to qualify for the corresponding Supreme Final - on judge's discretion.

- 3. All persons entering onto the Racecourse, by virtue of admission, agree to be bound by these Terms and Conditions and the General Rules of the Competition.
- 4. Aintree International Equestrian Centre and Aintree Racecourse reserve the right to refuse entry/hire without stating the reason, and to cancel the competition and all rights of admission.
- 5. Any person causing any damage, disruption or unwanted behaviour will be asked to leave the premises and will not be permitted to participate any further in the show.
- 6. Aintree International Equestrian Centre and Aintree Racecourse do not accept any responsibility or liability for any injury, accident, damage or illness to any person, property or animal whatsoever, or for any loss whatsoever, arising out of, or occurring at any competition, show or event. It shall be a condition of entry/hire of the Centre that each entrant shall indemnify the organisers against any legal action whatsoever arising from any accident.
- 7. All competitors and attendees must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the officials and stewards.
- 8. Parents or guardians are deemed responsible for their children and they must be supervised at all times.
- 9. Please also note that the Collecting Ring area is for the purpose of warming up. It is strictly not a viewing or standing area, nor is it to be used by anyone other than those entered in the current class.
- 10. BRITISH STANDARD APPROVED HARD HATS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES WHEN MOUNTED. Full and correct attire must be worn by all competitors when competing or hiring the Centre. For show jumping all competitors and grooms, when mounted, must wear a British Standard skull/hard hat, which must be fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination.
- 11. Any individual seen to be causing distress or suffering to any animal will be asked to leave the Racecourse and may be reported to the appropriate authorities.
- 12. No horse or pony under the age of 4 years shall be ridden at any competition.
- 13. Any persons responsible for a stallion must ensure that they are secure at all times including within the stables and the collecting ring, and correctly displaying the appropriate FEI approved ribbons and discs.
- 14. All horses and ponies competing or using the Centre must be fully vaccinated against equine flu, and must not have had any vaccination in the 6 days prior to attending.
- 15. Vaccination requirements for stabling may vary from time to time, as dictated by the British Horseracing Authority. Please see individual event page for details. Important updates will be published on our website and on our social media pages.
- 16. Horses and/or ponies must not be left unattended at any time when tied outside Horseboxes or trailers. Haynets are not permitted outside.
- 17. No horse and/or pony may be lunged in any area of the Racecourse. Strictly no lunging in the arena or collecting ring.
- 18. Competitors are requested, prior to leaving, to clean up any droppings, hay, straw or shavings from around their horsebox/trailer and to dispose of these at in the dpoo skips and bins provided.
- 19. Dogs must be kept on leads AT ALL TIMES and must be cleaned up after. Failure to do this will result in you being asked to leave the Racecourse. No dogs are allowed on the Racecourse track or in the stable yards AT ANY TIME.
- 20. It is recommended that all vehicles are fitted with a fire extinguisher.
- 21. Aintree International Equestrian Centre reserves the right to alter any schedule at any time without prior notice. Closing dates for all shows may be altered if the classes are full.
- 22. All entry and hire fees include VATe20%. All entries and hire fees must be paid for in full prior to leaving the Centre. A £15 administration fee will be payable on any outstanding accounts or dishonoured cheques, plus interest.
- 23. No entry or stable fees will be refunded.
- 24. Prize money not collected on the day will be forfeited.
- 25. If stables are in use for this show, a £30 cash deposit must be paid to the Stable Manager on arrival and will be returned once the stable has been inspected and has been fully emptied of bedding and hay.
- 26. Smoking or vaping is strictly forbidden in the stable area and in all buildings. Cigarette butts must be disposed of safely and in the bins provided.

- 34. Draw reins are not permitted at this show.
- 35. Horses and ponies must only be warmed up by those who are riding them in the competition.
- 36. The Show cannot be responsible for the clashing of Classes and exhibitors should bear this in mind when making their entries. We cannot guarantee timings, it is up to the competitor to keep an eye on when their class is. Entry fees WILL NOT be refunded if you miss your class or your class clashes.
- 37. REFUNDS will only be given on the production of a valid veterinary or medical certificate. Class entry fee and first aid fee will only be refunded. Online booking fee NOT included. Stables and hook ups (if available at the show) will not be refunded unless they have been resold.
