WELCOME!

Thank you for entering The Jockey Club RoR National Championships 2025

We are very much looking forward to welcoming you to Aintree.

Please do take the time to read all the information detailed on the following pages - they contain lots of useful information about the Championships.



TRAVELLING TO AINTREE

Postcode - L9 5AS

Aintree Racecourse is located on the A59, just one mile from the M57 and M58, which link the M62 and M6. Follow the A59 to Liverpool and the AA brown racecourse signs as you approach the racecourse.

If you are coming from the M57/M58, please follow Ormskirk Road (A59), past Asda, McDonalds and the Industrial Estate. Please take the left turn at the traffic lights for the racecourse, just after KFC and by The Toby Carvery Restaurant.

To enter the racecourse, go underneath the barriers and turn RIGHT for the stables at the mini roundabout or LEFT if you are a day competitor not stabling.



ARRIVAL

DAILY COMPETITORS (NOT STABLING)

- Daily horseboxes will be parked adjacent to the Equestrian Centre and an overflow lorry park will be alongside the racecourse track. All parking is on tarmac or hard standing.
- Gates will open at 6.00am each day, and no earlier.

STABLING COMPETITORS

• Your check in will be up at the stables. Drive straight past the grandstands with the Parade Ring on your right. You will then drive up a slight incline, next to the outdoor arena, then you need to turn right for the stables. The stable manager's office is located next to the gates into the main stable yard. There will be stables directional signage in place and parking stewards to guide you.

STABLES

The parking stewards will direct you on where to park when you arrive. Please follow their guidance when parking. There will be busy periods, so we do ask that you are patient with them and follow their instructions on where to park. Please unload as quickly and safely as possible.

- Please ensure you keep to the arrival times you have stated on your booking. Arrival times are: Monday 18th August: 2pm - 7.30pm
 All other days (Tuesday 19th-Sunday 24th August): 2pm - 7.30pm
 Day stables - from 7.30am
- The latest time you can arrive on site for stabling is 7.30pm.

If you feel you cannot make these times, you will need to email us for prior permission to info@aintreeequestriancentre.co.uk so that we can inform security.

ALL HORSES ENTERING RACECOURSE PROPERTY, INCLUDING THE RACECOURSE STABLES, MUST HAVE BEEN FULLY VACCINATED CORRECTLY AND HAVE NOT RECEIVED A VACCINATION IN THE 6 DAYS PRIOR TO ARRIVING.

- Horses stabling on site passports must be presented to the Stable Yard Manager for inspection before horses are unloaded. Please ensure your horse's vaccinations are up to date. If they are wrong, you will not be permitted to stable at the show.
- As per our terms and conditions, all horses STABLING at Aintree EC must have had a booster vaccination against Equine Influenza in the PRECEDING 6 MONTHS, and be 6 days clear of having had any vaccination. The last vaccination must have been between the 18th February 2025 and the 11th August 2025. ALL PASSPORTS WILL BE CHECKED ON ARRIVAL. Horses will not be permitted to stable at Aintree if they do not have the correct vaccinations.
- All horses ATTENDING BUT NOT STABLING at Aintree EC must have had a booster vaccination against Equine Influenza in the PRECEDING 12 MONTHS, and be 6 days clear of having had any vaccination. PLEASE HAVE YOUR PASSPORT AVAILABLE FOR CHECKING.
- A £30 stable cash deposit per stable will be required when you arrive. This is to be paid at the Stable Managers office. THIS IS STRICTLY CASH ONLY
- ARRIVAL DATE AND TIME From 2pm each day, unless you have been emailed by Aintree to say otherwise.

- All stables will need to be fully emptied ready for the next competitor before you leave. Stables will then be checked and the £30 deposit will be refunded back to you when you leave.
- If your stable is being turned around on the same day for another competitor, we will contact you to make you aware of this. You can also check with the stable manager on arrival.
- We do have some tack/storage lockers near the permanent stables which are available to use. These are £5 cash each to hire, and they are on a first come, first served basis. A £5 cash key deposit will also be required which will be refundable on return.
- All stables will have two bales of shavings when you arrive.
- Please ensure you bring your own feed. There is no feed store at Aintree.
- Hay and haylage is available to pre book through Horse Monkey before the show starts. Please ensure you pre book to ensure we have enough.
- No mucking out equipment or wheelbarrows will be available. Please ensure you bring your own.
- Please provide your own water and feed buckets.
- Strictly NO SMOKING in the stable complex or in any building on site.
- All equipment and belongings are left at your own risk.
- The solarium will be closed for this show.
- The wash down bays will be open with hot and cold water.
- The route to the Equestrian Centre from the stables is along the rubberised walkway in front of the grandstands along the side of the racecourse. Passing places will be put in place along this walkway. All horses MUST use this route at all times and not use the back of the Grandstands or the tarmacked area.
- The Equestrian Centre is about a 10 minute walk from the stables, so ensure you allow plenty of time for your journey before your class.
- The stables have a 24 hour manager on site and they will be located in the Stable Manager's Office by the entrance to the stables.
- The stables will be closed at 11.00pm each night and the Stable Manager will do regular walk rounds during the night. We request that competitors avoid going into the yard after this time to allow the horses to settle and rest. The stables will be back open at 6am but we request that the noise is kept to a minimum due to local residents who are overlooking the stable yards.
- Strictly no dogs in the stable yards at any time.
- No bikes or scooters are permitted in the stables at any time. Electric scooters are not permitted on the racecourse at any time due to us being classed as a public highway.
- **DEPARTURE TIMES**. Stables need to be vacated promptly after your last class due to us having to turn stables around for the next competitor. If your stable is a same day turnaround, we will contact you by email to make you aware of this (please check your emails). All stables need to be departed by 9am on Monday no exceptions. When emptying stables, we recommend you start doing this earlier in the day and leaving a day bed for your horse. Emptying after a busy day is hard work!

GRAZING

- There is a small grazing area in the stable yard & at the bottom of the horsebox park. Grazing is also
 permitted in the centre of the racecourse between 6pm and 7pm ONLY. Please DO NOT graze horses
 whilst classes/tests are taking place in the centre of the course.
- When grazing, please use a bridle/chifney and lunge line to reduce the risk of having loose horses!
- Please DO NOT graze horses on the racecourse track or the side of the horse walk as this is sprayed with chemicals frequently.

HOOK UPS

- Please advise the Stable Manager when you arrive that you have booked a hook up and you will be issued with a Hook Up pass to display in your windscreen and directed to the hook up steward.
- Those who have booked hook ups will need to bring their own adapters. Aintree do not provide any adapters or leads.
- Please ensure that your hook up equipment is in full working order. The electricity supply at Aintree is checked regularly and is in full working order. If your hook up equipment does not work or trips the supply, we may not be able to give you this service.
- If you are a non-hook up, you will be directed to park away from the hook up lorries.
- There are bins located around the stable yard and also in the lorry park. Please ensure that you help keep Aintree tidy. We are renowned for having a tidy racecourse and like to keep it that way!
- Please ensure all litter and droppings are picked up around your lorries.

HOSTEL ROOMS

- Hostel room keys can be collected from the Stable managers office. A £10 cash key deposit is required.
- Please respect others who are staying in the hostel no late night parties!
- Strictly no cooking permitted in the hostel rooms at any time.
- The rooms have 4 beds in them with bedding provided, although people do tend to bring their own duvets/sleeping bags and pillows.
- There are electrical points in the room to charge mobile phones.
- No TV's are provided in these rooms.
- No dogs in the hostel.
- Hostel rooms need to be vacated by 10am on day of departure, to allow for turnarounds.

SHOWERS

- Showers are located in the Hostel, by the stables.
- The shower facilities are only available to those who do not have showers in their lorry.
- There will be showers available all day in the hostel, located next to the permanent stable yard.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult.
- The showers will be cleaned and disinfected regularly. If you are not happy with the cleanliness of the showers, please inform the cleaner or member of staff as soon as possible.

TOILETS

- There are toilets located in both stable yards, the hostel and in the Equestrian Centre.
- All toilets will be cleaned and disinfected regularly throughout the show.
- If you are not happy with the cleanliness of the toilets, please inform the cleaner or member of staff as soon as possible.
- Please respect our toilet facilities and leave them how you expect to find them. Please flush!

The RoR Show Office will be open on the following times -

Tuesday - Saturday: 8am - 8pm

Sunday: 8am - 12noon



WARM UP ARENAS

- The outdoor arena by the stables is available to use all day. Maximum 6 horses/riders at once. We advise competitors to make good use of this for warming up for dressage. No lunging.
- The walkway down to the arena is a crucial part of your warm up before you get to the arena. This is strictly walking only. A nice leg stretch down there and also great for cooling down after you compete too.
- The outdoor at the back of the indoor arena will be available for the duration of the show. It is only a small area so a maximum of 6 horses/riders at once.
- The indoor warm up is available to use before or during your class.
- There will be a large warm up area in the centre of the racecourse on grass. This will be available to use during the show between 8am 6pm. Please ensure that you are not on your own when you are riding in this area.
- Please be aware that there is also a dressage competition taking place outdoors and avoid this area when you are warming up. Please be respectful to other competitors No galloping allowed!
- The indoor warm up has speakers connected to the collecting ring steward who will keep you all updated and count you down. This is so you know when it's time for you to come into the indoor warm up and also when it's your turn to go into the main arena.
- The main arena is not permitted to be used unless you are doing the arena walks before a dressage competition. If you access the main arena before you are permitted to do so, you will be reported to the show organisers and may be eliminated from the show.
- There are a lot of arenas and we would really appreciate help with poo picking too, so please bare this in mind to help keep our surfaces at their very best.
- Please note that no lunging is allowed on the surfaced arenas. There will be space in the centre of the racecourse (on grass) where you will be permitted to lunge. This must be well away from any competition arenas.
- Please note that you are not permitted to go on the racecourse track. This is strictly out of bounds other than using the course crossings which will be signposted.

GALLOPS

- The gallops maybe permitted to use for walking and trotting only at certain times. These times will be confirmed nearer the show and after competitions have finished. Please check the RoR Championships Facebook page or HorseMonkey for these times.
- Anyone seen to be abusing the use of the gallops will be asked to leave the showground.

DRAWN ORDERS AND TIMINGS

• Drawn orders and times will be sent to you via Horse Monkey or can be accessed via the link below when they have been published.

PROVISIONAL TIMES will be available on Horse Monkey on the 11th August

FINAL TIMES will be available on Horse Monkey the evening before your class starts. This is to allow for withdrawals which may affect the timings.

CLICK HERE

- Drawn orders and times will also be displayed on Horse Monkey throughout the show.
- Please ensure you keep track of the times, in case there are any changes due to withdrawals.
- Timings will be detailed for each class on the drawn orders.
- It is the competitors responsibility to check timings because they will change.

COURSE WALKING

- There will be a course walk at the beginning of each jumping class.
- Course walk timings will be detailed on Horse Monkey with the drawn orders.
- Course Walking the first 8 horses to jump will be permitted to be held in the indoor warm up.
- Horses 9-14 to jump can be held in the outdoor warm up and there's a door into the main arena for easy access.
- Anyone else will be asked to hold horses outside the arena, keeping your distance with the horses.

PRESENTATIONS

- There will be mounted presentations for Championship classes in the arena the class took place in for all classes.
- The top ten will need to come forward for the mounted presentation.

DRESSAGE GUIDELINES PLEASE REFER TO THE SCHEDULE FOR FULL GUIDELINES

- Final Times will be sent to you via Horse Monkey.
- All dressage classes will be judged under British Dressage rules.
- Whips and callers are NOT allowed in the championship classes. Callers are not provided by the show organisers for non championship classes.
- Two CDs or MP3 files must be provided for the music classes and must be clearly labelled.
- Two clearly visible bridle numbers & back numbers must be worn during working in and whilst competing Bridle numbers can be worn on numnahs.
- No draw reins or martingales allowed. Breastplates are allowed.
- Intro, Prelim and Novice classes snaffle bridles only.
- An updated timetable, including dressage times, showjumping drawn orders and showing class entries
 will be put on Aintree's website on the 15th August. Please ensure that you continue to check the
 UPDATED timetable, because there may be some slight changes. Link below:-



SHOWING GUIDELINES

PLEASE REFER TO THE SCHEDULE FOR FULL GUIDELINES

- Competitors may be asked to come out in pairs for their individual shows.
- Back numbers must be worn in all classes, in the Glamour Stakes bridle numbers are permitted.
- All ridden showing classes to be judged in Riding Horse format unless otherwise stated. Judged on manners, way of going and individual show of no more than 1½ minutes to show walk, trot and canter, stand and walk off on a long rein, also adhering to each class description.
- All ridden show classes will enter in single file on the right rein and will demonstrate walk, trot and canter on both reins as directed by the Steward.
- Classes will be split if required due to numbers and space. If classes need to be split the division will be made by the use of a draw.
- A current standard safety hat with the chin strap fastened must be worn at all times by anybody mounted on or leading a horse.
- Grooms must dress appropriately for a Championship show and must wear a hard hat with the chinstrap fastened whilst around horses at all times.
- Spurs please check the RoR Rules for competitor dress. Link:- https://www.ror.org.uk/rules
- The judge's decision is FINAL.
- Shoeing The RoR rules regarding shoes applies to all RoR Ridden classes

- Not before start times are there as a guideline. If the class is ready to start at the not before start time stated, we will start at that time. Do not miss your class, it is the competitor's responsibility to keep an eye of the arenas. Do not rely on just announcements.
- Class clashes unfortunately due to the number of entries we have received it is likely that some classes may clash. If you feel that your classes may clash, you need to make a decision on the day to decide which class you would prefer to compete in. There will be no refunds on clashing classes.

• The evening performance timetable will be available on Saturday afternoon. The first class for the evening performance will start at 6pm prompt with most classes taking 20 minutes per class.

• ALL CLASSES ARE STRICTLY DRAWN ORDER - Draws will be on the following link:



- Aintree tend to allow 2 minutes per showjumping round.
- Open classes will be run Single Phase. Speed 325 mpm (as British Novice)
- Penalties —

Knockdown - 4 faults

First Refusal - 4 faults

Second Refusal (at same fence or another on course) - Elimination

Turning a Circle - 4 faults

Circling Twice - Elimination

Fall of Horse and/or Rider - Elimination

Jumping Same Obstacle Twice - Elimination

Error of Course - Elimination

- Back numbers need to be worn. Please ensure you declare at the collecting ring before your class starts.
- BS rules apply.

BEST SHOD AWARD

Competitors need to enter on Horse Monkey and report to the stable office where the farrier will be based Tues - Sun (10am - 4pm). The farrier will judge in three sections (Shod All Round, Shod In Front, Barefoot). The winners will be announced on Sunday.

CATERING AND REFRESHMENTS

- Tophams, our café and bar overlooking the arenas, will be open for the duration of the show, offering breakfast & lunch with daily specials. There will also be a bar open in the evening in the arena for you to relax and enjoy watching the classes taking place.
- Tophams cafe will be open 7.30am 2pm daily.
- Tipple N Cheese & Choc Spot will be open in the arena 11am until the last class finishes each day.

ENTERTAINMENT

Due to classes running late into the evening, we encourage people to come and support fellow competitors in the Indoor Arena.

The bar will be open until the last class finishes and catering units will be serving food in the evening.

Only our official appointed event photographer is allowed to take any images and sell them to the public. No other individual or company has permission to attend The Jockey Club RoR National Championships to take images of multiple competitors and sell them to members of the public or publish online/on social media. Those suspected of doing so will be asked to leave the venue.

No videography other than that commissioned directly by RoR will be permitted without prior written agreement. There will be live streaming taking place during the event via ClipMyHorseTV.

Taking images/videos of your friends or family, for personal use, is of course absolutely permitted.

DOGS

Important notice about dogs

Due to BHA rules, dogs must not enter the stabling area.

Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.

We ask that all dogs are cleaned up after they foul. This is an increasing problem at Aintree and people will be asked to leave if they are seen to not adhere to this rule and dogs will no longer be allowed to come on site.

We request that dogs are kept out of the café and eating areas.

Please keep your dogs away from trade stands. We have had many complaints about them fouling near the stands.

Dogs are not permitted on the racecourse track at any time.

IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

As you will see when you arrive at Aintree, we are in the middle of a large housing estate surrounding the racecourse and they will notice we have an equestrian event on, especially in the stables lorry park area. Please be respectful of our neighbours when you are at the show.

- Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- The poo picking equipment will be available to use and we do ask that you clean up any mess in the arena and lorry park before you leave. We like to keep Aintree tidy. Please ensure you sanitise your hands before and after using the equipment.
- We have a Vet on call. Please speak to the Show Office or the Stable Manager's office if required.
- We have a farrier on site based at the stables 8am 5pm, Tuesday to Sunday. There will not be a farrier available outside of these times. The farrier will need to be paid at the time for any shoeing (cash only).
- The Show office will be manned throughout the show. This is located in the Tophams Cafe in the Indoor arena, overlooking the warm up area. If you need to speak to the show office, please call 0151 522 2949. This will be manned 8am 6pm.
- There may be routine testing for prohibited substances taking place throughout the show. For more information about prohibited substances and routine testing, please read the Rules of RoR. .
- Please see the schedule for the withdrawal and refund policy.
- Do not attend if feeling unwell.
- Please ensure that you lock vehicles and do not leave items unattended at all times
- If you have a spare couple of hours, there is a great shopping centre right next door to Aintree which includes the following shops:- Next, TK Maxx, Home Sense, Boots, The Range, M and S, Hobbycraft, Curries and many more. Liverpool One in the centre of the city is also a must!
