GENERAL RULES

PLEASE TAKE THE TIME TO READ THE RULES FOR THE SHOW

1. For RoR registered horses only, holding current Competition Membership and for riders/handlers aged 15 years or over at 1st January 2026
2. Registration link: <https://www.ror.org.uk/registration>
3. The Rules of RoR will be in force at this event: <https://ror.org.uk/welfare-at-our-training-and-competitions>
4. Anyone mounted on a horse at any time, must wear a current standard safety hat with the chin strap fastened correctly
5. All ridden horses, dressage, showing and jumping, must be aged 4 years or over. Stallions are permitted to compete in Dressage, Show-Jumping and Arena Eventing and must be identified by a Stallion Disc on the bridle and/or the rider must wear a yellow cross body band. Stallions and colts are not permitted in any showing classes including the Challenge.
6. In the interest of horse welfare, RoR has implemented new conditions for anyone entering a horse at this event.
 - a) If, in the opinion of the Organiser and/or RoR, any horse's welfare is believed to be compromised, the immediate removal of that horse from any arena will be requested
 - b) RoR discourages the showing of over fat horses in ALL show classes and judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.
 - c) RoR reserves the right to disqualify competitors at RoR events if in the opinion of the officials there is a mismatch between the weight and size of the rider and the horse. The official's decision is final.
 - d) Policy Statement: There is widespread concern that the welfare of certain horses is being compromised by overweight riders. There are many other factors involved, including the skill and fitness of the rider; the weight, size and fitness of the horse; the nature of the exercise and the suitability of the tack. As a general guide the weight of the rider and saddle should not exceed 17% of the horse's optimum weight consistent with a body condition score of 3/5. In practical terms this means that a 500kg thoroughbred can carry up to 13 1/2 stone. An overweight horse with a body condition of 4/5 (fat) or 5/5 (obese) is already carrying significant burden and the weight of the rider must be reduced accordingly. The maximum permissible ratio is 20%, so if the weight of the rider and saddle together is subsequently found to be in excess of 20%, then that competitor will be disqualified.
 - e) If, in the opinion of the Judge/Judges, in any class, a horse is unsound, the horse must be withdrawn from the show by the Participant and/or Owner and leave the ring. A Judge may also ask a Participant and/or Owner to remove his horse from the ring, if in his/her opinion the Participant or Owner is ill-mannered. If in the opinion of the Judge the behaviour of a horse is deemed unsafe, it will be asked to leave the ring, reported to RoR and will be reassessed at its next show by a person appointed by RoR.
7. An independent Welfare Stewarding Team will be onsite to help educate and advise on matters relating to the wellbeing of former racehorses competing at this event. The team welcome questions from members.
8. There will be routine sampling taking place at this event under FEI ruling. For more details about banned substances: <https://inside.fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules>
9. The organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards
10. OBJECTIONS must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £100. The deposit will be returned upon successful acceptance and approval of such objection. Any objections must be lodged with the RoR MD by the end of the event on Sunday 23rd August 2026 by emailing info@ror.org.uk
11. In the event of any class being over/under subscribed, we reserve the right to cancel any open class of our choice and a full refund of entries will be given, less the original booking fee.
12. It is the competitor's responsibility to check each individual class criteria for eligibility.
13. In the event of the dressage classes being oversubscribed, a waiting list will operate
14. The Organiser reserves the right to change the Ring allocation if entries/weather conditions warrant.
15. It is the competitors responsibility to enter the classes that they are qualified and eligible for and to read the schedule. Entries will be forfeited if entrants are not eligible.
16. All entrants must also adhere to Aintree International Equestrian Centre's terms and conditions which can be viewed on <https://aintreeequestriancentre.co.uk>
17. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers, RoR or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers, RoR nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury, illness to horses, owners, riders, grooms, spectators, dogs, exhibitors, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever. The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.

WITHDRAWAL OF ENTRIES AND REFUNDS POLICY 2026

Competitor Refunds are to comply with RoRNC Refund policy:

1. For any class withdrawals or stable cancellations received prior to entries closing at midnight on 01/08/26 - a full refund, minus a £2.50 per class and £10/stable per night admin charge will be processed.
2. Withdrawals or stable cancellations from 02.08.26 (00.01hrs) to midnight on 10.08.26 – a refund will be issued on the production of a valid veterinary or doctor's certificate relating directly to the horse/rider/handler entered for this event and will be subject to a £3/class and £15/stable per night admin charge
3. Withdrawals or stable cancellations from 11.08.26 (00.01hrs) to midnight on 14.08.26 – a refund will be issued on the production of a valid veterinary or doctor's certificate relating directly to the horse/rider/handler entered for this event and will be subject to a £5/per class admin charge. Any additional services like stabling, hook-up etc will not be refunded.
4. No entry refund requests will be accepted after midnight on Friday 14th August 2026
5. In the event of any classes and/or the show being cancelled by the organisers' for whatever reason after 1st August 2026, All entry fees and stable fees will be refunded by ARDL, less the Horse Monkey booking fee and a £2.50 per class and £2.50 per stable administration fee
6. All Horse Monkey booking fees are non refundable
7. All withdrawal/refund requests regarding entry fees must be made to info@aintreeequestriancentre.co.uk and will be reviewed and processed within 30 days
8. Any queries re stabling, accommodation, hook ups etc must be made to info@aintreeequestriancentre.co.uk

VACCINATIONS

IMPORTANT NOTES RE PASSPORTS, VACCINATIONS & EQUINE INFLUENZA (EI)

Vaccination policy for the stables

In accordance with Aintree Equestrian Centre's terms and conditions for this event, all horses stabling on-site must:

- Have received a booster vaccination against Equine Influenza within the **preceding 6 months**
- Be **at least 6 days clear** of any vaccination prior to arrival
- Have a **complete and correctly dated vaccination record** in line with **BHA requirements**
- Have received their most recent vaccination **between 17 February 2026 and 11 August 2026**

All passports will be checked on arrival.

Horses that do not meet these requirements **will not be permitted to stable** at Aintree Equestrian Centre.

Vaccination Policy if competing but not stabling

All horses attending but not stabling at Aintree Equestrian Centre must:

- Have received a booster vaccination against Equine Influenza within the **preceding 12 months**
- Be **at least 6 days clear** of any vaccination
- Have a **complete and correctly dated vaccination record** in line with **BHA requirements**

Please ensure your horse's passport is available for inspection.

Horses that do not meet these requirements **will not be permitted to compete** at Aintree Equestrian Centre.

1. Every horse attending this event (including travelling equine companions) must be accompanied by their own current and undeniably valid passport with up to date records of vaccinations for Equine Influenza, completed, signed and stamped on each line by a Veterinary Surgeon, who is not the owner of the horse.
2. Horses stabling on site - passports must be presented to the Stable Yard Manager for inspection before horses are unloaded
3. Horses not stabling on site - passports must be presented at the Show Office before being unloaded.
4. NO VALID PASSPORT - NO ACCESS AT ALL
5. Horses may be scanned for microchip identification.
6. Owners, grooms, riders and all personnel to heed any bio-security rules and recommendations in place and must take all reasonable precaution to avoid unnecessary cross-contamination.
7. Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at shows.

FARRIER'S AWARDS

Entry Fee - £3.50 JUDGE: TBC

A competition to promote and reward best practice in three categories:

1. Shod all-round
2. Shod in front only
3. Barefoot

The judge will be available at the Stable Yard at designated times each day to assess the following:-

- (a) The condition and trimming of the feet
- (b) The making (or preparation) and fitting of the shoes (if applicable)
- (c) The nailing and the position of the clips (if applicable)

There will be a rosette and recognition prize to the Judge's choice in each category. The winners will be announced on Sunday 23rd August

BEST TURNED OUT AWARDS

There will be Best Turned Out rosette in each of the 'Have a Go' ridden and in hand showing classes.

GOOD HORSEMANSHIP AWARDS

There will be Good Horsemanship rosettes awarded the show, judged independently by the welfare stewarding team. These awards are kindly supported by Agria.

SUITABLY MOUNTED CERTIFICATES

As part of RoR's commitment to welfare, stewards will be awarding 'suitably mounted' certificates. These will be given to riders who meet the 20% limit, based on weight readings taken at the event. DRESSAGE RULES

1. All Dressage classes will be judged under British Dressage rules.
2. Whips and Callers are NOT allowed in the Championship classes
3. Provisional times will be released on the 14th August.
Confirmed times will be released the evening before the day of the class to allow for withdrawals
It is the competitors responsibility to check timings.
4. Two Bridle Numbers must be worn during working in and whilst competing and must be clearly visible
5. No draw reins or martingales allowed.
6. Breast plates are allowed. Intro, Prelim and Novice classes – snaffle bridles only.
7. Competitors may enter Championship classes at two consecutive levels only, so long as they are qualified.
8. Freestyle to Music: general rules applicable to these classes – please see BD Members Handbook
9. REMINDER to everyone taking part in dressage and FSM classes – the trimming of whiskers and horses' ears is banned. Please see Welfare Section of the BD Members Handbook. This is available online via the British Dressage website.
10. There is a restriction to the number of dressage classes that any horse may be entered in, on a single day.
Horses competing at Novice level or below: 4 classes including warm-up tests, Elementary & Medium 3 classes including warm-up tests, Advanced Medium and above – 2 classes including warm-up
11. Official BD Stewards will be appointed and tack inspections will take place
12. Please see BD Members Handbook for rules re tack and competition wear
13. Entries maybe restricted in any class including Championships. In the event of a class being oversubscribed then a wait list will operate and members will be notified of spaces as they come available.
14. Dispensation certificates are to be presented to the secretary before the start of the class.
15. Competitors must attend prize givings, or ensure that they are represented, when requested by the Organiser.
16. Failure to attend (unless agreed with the Organiser) may result in forfeit of prize money, rosettes or other awards.
17. Prize givings will be mounted unless otherwise stated and correct competition dress should be worn.
18. All tests will be the new 2024 BD tests
19. There will be one guaranteed arena walk at the start of each dressage day in the indoor arena (early morning). Any further arena walks maybe added if timing allows, but not guaranteed.

RIDDEN SHOWING – Have A Go Classes

1. For ridden mares and geldings only and must aged 4yrs old or over
2. The Judge will not ride in these classes
3. All classes will be judged in standard 'Riding Horse' format unless otherwise stated
4. Rosettes to 6th
5. Best Turned Out rosette to be awarded in each class
6. Horses to be shod all-round in ridden showing classes

Judges - Louise Gaunt & tbc
Judges will rotate throughout the day

CLASS 108 - Ridden Showing – Newcomers
For horses who have raced on or since 01.01.2025

CLASS 109 - Ridden Showing – Veteran
For horses aged 15 years and over

CLASS 110 - Ridden Showing - Flat Racer
For horses whose last race was on the flat, turf or the all-weather.

CLASS 111 - Ridden Showing - Jumper
For horses whose last race was over hurdles and/or fences inc P2P

CLASS 112 - Ridden Showing – Riding Horse
Open to horses who have raced or have been in training

CLASS 113 - Ridden Showing – Always A Star
For horses who have won more than £70,000 or have won 10 or more races inc P2P.

CLASS 114 - RoR Ridden Concours d'Elegance
For horses who have raced or have been in training, to be ridden astride or side saddle, to be judged on turnout and way of going

CLASS 115 - Ridden Showing – Longevity
For horses who raced 30 times or more on the track, inc P2P

CLASS 116 - Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Show Series Qualifier 2027

Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won an - a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, RoR Tattersalls Show Series Qualifier, RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier or any other open class except RoR TBA Challenge Show Series or other Working Hunter type classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not taken into account.

Horses WILL be ridden by the judge. Horses will be stripped for conformation.

Horses may remain in RoR Tattersalls Novice Show Series classes until they have won (win) 3 RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series /RoR Tattersalls Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the RoR Tattersalls Novice Show Series Final at the RoR and The Jockey Club National Championships that August in August of the same year.

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships 2027. All entries MUST have RACED in GB. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) should the entries exceed 20.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series.

Prizes - RoR rosettes 1 - 4 plus RoR official merchandise 1 £30, 2 £20 and 3 £10.

CLASS 117 - Tattersalls RoR OPEN Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2027

The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead in 2027. All entries MUST have RACED in GB.

Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships 2027

Voucher for RoR Branded Prize to highest placed Veteran (15+) to be redeemed from the RoR Office

Prizes - RoR rosettes 1 - 4 plus RoR official merchandise 1 £30, 2 £20 and 3 £10.

The highest placed Veteran (15+) also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Ridden Veteran Series Final 2027.



CLASS 118 - Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2027

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur.

The Series is open to AMATEURS only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Judge will not ride at the qualifier but will ride in the Series Final.

The first three go forward to the Series Final at Hickstead in June 2027

The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships 2027

Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships 2027

Prizes - RoR rosettes 1 - 4 plus RoR official merchandise 1 £20, 2 £10 and 3 £5.

The highest placed Veteran (15+) also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Ridden Veteran Series Final 2027.

CLASS 119 - LIHS OPEN RACEHORSE TO SHOW HORSE QUALIFIER 2026

Competitors and horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/ Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS Open Racehorse to Show Horse series.

Any competitor who qualifies for the Final must then complete full LIHS Qualified registration within 14 days of qualification for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will be taken off the cost of Full LIHS registration).

Competitors/ horses with existing BSHA membership/ registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership / Registration for these classes. Open Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm.

Open to thoroughbred horses or Arab horses retired from race training. Rider to be 15yrs or over.

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Open Racehorse to Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry.

There will be no Ride Judge in this class in qualifiers or at the Final.

QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE FULL LIHS QUALIFIED MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION.

Please note a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible membership must be in place before entering any BSHA LIHS qualifying class. (2026)

In addition:

- The two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the BSHA Open Racehorse to Show Horse final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September.
- The two highest placed unqualified horses ridden by Rising Star-eligible competitors will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September.

Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

The exception to the above terms and in accordance with RoR rules for competition is that all horses entered in this class at this event must hold current Competition Membership with RoR.
